2009- Pacemaker Award

The 2aToday/The Vid staff was one of five high school news broadcasts nationwide to win a 2009 Pacemaker Award from the National Scholastic Press Association (NSPA).

Chosen from a field of 50 news shows, the Findlay High School newspaper was one of the 10 semifinalists and eventual winner throughout the country. This was the second time, out of three nominations, the 2a- Today staff won a Pacemaker in the school's history.

The Pacemaker is the highest honor in the country, it is considered the "Emmy Award" of high school journalism."

"This is the top award in the country that any high school broadcast staff can achieve," Executive Director of NSPA Logan Aimone said. "As in professional broadcasting, the competition is tough, competitive.

"It recognizes those hard working and dedicated staffs and advisers across the country. The five winners did exceptional work and went above and beyond what is expected. Their schools and community have much to be proud of and members of the student press salute you."

The Pacemaker winners were announced at the NSPA's fall national convention awards ceremony in Washington, DC.

"Being a Pacemaker semifinalist was an honor, but winning was a great accomplishment for our staff. All of our staffs, both past and present, share this award," Adviser Jim McGonnell said. "Our winning tradition continues to challenge future staffs to improve and make the news show and video yearbook even better."

"It is a tribute to the 2008-09 staff who, last year, set a goal to win the Pacemaker after its first one five years ago. In Washington that goal became a reality. The competition was incredible and winning is truly an honor."

The Broadcast Pacemaker contest is co-sponsored by SchoolTube.com and the Radio and Television News Directors Foundation (RTNDF).

Entries consisted of an entire broadcast news program no longer than 20 minutes.

Entries were judged based on the following criteria:

Content/Coverage

Relevancy to audience, significance of subjects covered writing and editing of the script language appropriate to audience, smooth transitions, recording and editing of the show, good connections between segments, interviewing skills, interviews were conversational, technical quality, lighting framing, audio. The winners were selected by members of the RTNDF and national broadcast advisers.

"The RTNDF is one of the most influential broadcasting organizations in the country." junior Jimmy Eckhardt said. "One of the best things about winning the Pacemaker, was the staff members of that group, staff members in the DC broadcast market and other well known national advisers selected us."

"They were impressed with what our staff had done. Winning gives us national recognition and exposure for our school district and our staff."

Findlay was the only Ohio school to be nominated and win a Pacemaker.

"Representing Ohio and getting our third nomination was truly an honor and great for our program. The competition was incredible and to win was awesome. One of the coolest things about winning is now our videos are posted on Schooltube and anyone in the nation can see our work. We actually have a lot of video projects posted on Schooltube for our website," producer senior Carrie Lammers said.

McGonnell is proud of his students' dedication to the program.

"We are a very small staff, and our kids work really hard doing many community projects, the video yearbook and a news broadcast. These were professionals that were impressed with what our student staff members did last year. Winning gives us credibility and national recognition for our school district and our video program," McGonnell said.

Blue and Gold Staff Members Win National Awards

Five Blue & Gold staff members won national awards and the paper finished 10th in the country at the Journalism Education Association/National Scholastic Press Association's national convention held in Washington, DC.

In the National Write-off contest, Editor in Chief junior John Sisser and Feature Editor junior Kim Maples won Superior in newswriting and newspaper layout respectively.

Photographer junior Katie Logsdon won Excellent in Sports Photography and Photography Editor senior Katie Trinko and Sports Editor sophomore Lexi Perault won honorable mention in Photography Portfolio and Sports Writing respectively.

"Winning five National Write-off Contest awards is a great accomplishment for our very talented young staff members," Adviser Jim McGonnell said. "This is one of the first years we had two editors win superiors and to place nationally is amazing, especially at the largest convention ever held."

The Write-off Contest is a national competition that recognizes the nation's best young journalists.

"We are a very young staff, so to have five national winners and place 10th in the Best of Show Contest certainly says a lot about how hard the staff works. It's difficult for people to understand that this is the best of the best in the entire country and four foreign countries," McGonnell said.

Judges for both contests are high school and college journalism teachers from some of the best programs in the nation and members of the professional press.

The Write-off Contest included 2267 entries from 41 states, the most participants ever.

Besides placing in the National Write-off Contest, the Blue & Gold finished 10th in the Best of Show Competition.

Blue & Gold is a consistent top 10 finisher in the Best of Show Contest.

There were a record-setting 6347 attendees at this convention.

"It was great to be back in DC after attending the Inauguration last January as a staff. I went to some really good classes and learned a lot. I was very happy winning one of the top awards in newswriting, our entire staff did really well," Sisser said.

While in DC the staff toured the White House, US Capital, Arlington National Cemetery, and the Newseum.
