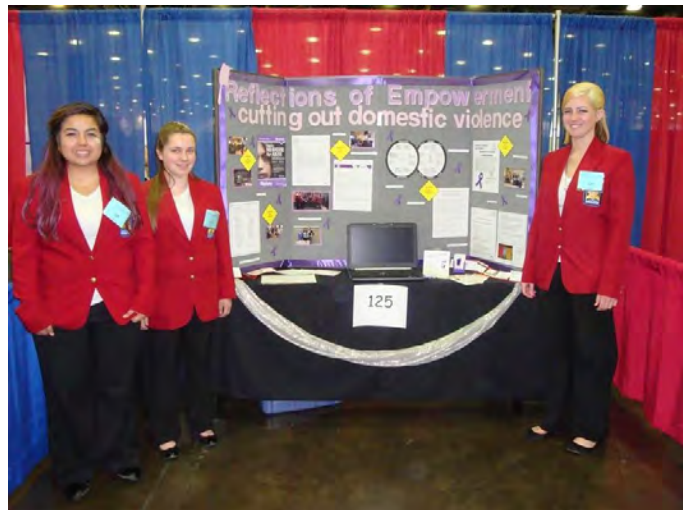

Congratulations to Tayler Stevens, Makayla Jackson and advisor Laurie Collert! They placed second in the nation at the Future Educators Association National Conference.



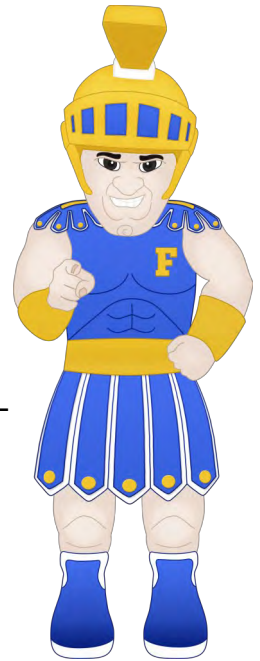
The senior team from cosmetology won gold in the career pathways showcase competition! Well done Desi Cunningham, Alexis Escamilla, and Mackenzie Howard.

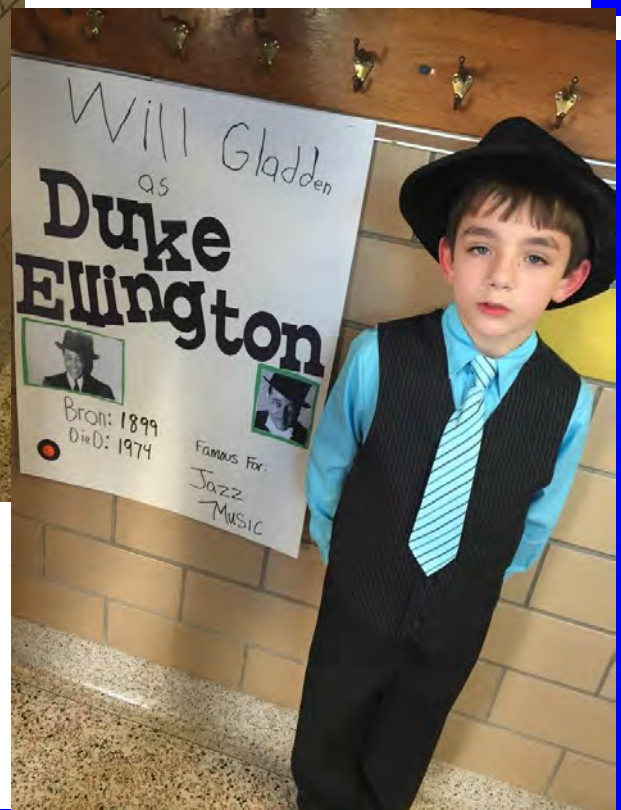


Students received new glasses as part of the iSee program. Thank you Dr. Seng for helping our students be ready to learn!

National Playground Safety Week 2015 is April 20-24!

Check out all playground equipment before your child plays on it.

Look for exposed nails or screws, rust, or sharp edges on all play equipment. During summer months and sunny days, check metal surfaces (like those on slides) to make sure they aren't hot to the touch.

Only let your kids play on playgrounds that have adequate adult supervision. It never hurts to have an extra set of eyes helping you watch your busy little one.

The AAP advises to avoid dressing kids in loose fitting clothing or clothes with drawstrings or dangling straps when planning a playground playdate. Drawstrings, straps, and loose clothing can catch on equipment, leading to injury or strangulation.

Teach children the basic rules of the playground, like avoiding walking directly in front of or behind swinging children. To avoid injuries, discourage kids from twisting or pushing empty swings.

Guide your children to age-appropriate equipment, and monitor them closely. For example, younger preschoolers may need to be in swings that have safety bars and high-backed seats to keep them from falling off.

Check sandboxes for garbage and debris and check all play surfaces for objects like broken glass.
